Examples of democratically selected socio-political and infrastructural strategies to enhance resilience in South African townships.



**WORK TOWARDS** broadening, maintaining corridors, roads, fire breaks and fire exits



**REFINE** integrated ER strategies and household responses to fire




**ENHANCE** preparedness by providing access to low-cost fire responses e.g. sand, buckets and fire blankets



**ALLOCATE** open space and public institutions for emergency refuge\*



**PROMOTE** enhanced building standards and site selection for informal dwellings



**MAINTAIN** and **OPTIMIZE** public infrastructure such as drainage systems, roads, taps and toilets, by building water zones with washing facilities, toilets and bins




**ENHANCE** solid waste management practices

**SECURE AND ENHANCE** access to welfare and documentation

**EMBRACE** the unlearning of socially negative community behaviour, e.g. Solid waste and waste water practices




**EMBRACE** climate activism, climate champions, leadership and support community cohesion
